### The 2010 Maryland Champion for Crime Victims Award Honorees:

Gary D. Maynard, has been Maryland Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services since March 1, 2007. Before coming to Maryland, his career has included distinguished correctional services in several states. MCVRC honors him for his commitment to treating Maryland's crime victims with dignity, respect and sensitivity, especially in regard to providing needed reform to Maryland's criminal injuries compensation process. He has held many state and national offices and received numerous awards for his outstanding service. We are pleased to present Secretary Maynard with the 2010 Maryland Champion for Crime Victims Award.

Margery Patten, whose son, Michael was murdered in 2001, is a dedicated survivor who assists other families of homicide victims in their journey through the criminal justice system and through their grief and loss. Her life is a role model for others. It is reflected in her caring support and activities with the MCVRC support group, with her presence with victims at trial and parole hearing, through participation in Victim Impact Panels in correctional facilities, and as an active member of the State Board of Victim Services. Margery is a MCVRC volunteer whose willing hands and heart are depended upon to help with the annual Chocolate Affair, annual Ceremony of Remembrance for families of homicide victims and whenever her volunteer services are needed. We are honored to recognize Margery with the 2010 *Unsung Hero for Crime Victims Award*.

Glen Plutschak is an active member of the MCVRC Board of Directors and has been a friend to victim issues over the span of his career in public service. Glen advocated for MCVRC to address the needs of identity theft victims. As Regional Administrator in the Division of Parole & Probation, he worked to improve the collection of restitution for crime victims. A former Administrator in the Advanced & Specialized Training Unit in Maryland's Police & Correctional Training Commissions, Glen challenged his colleagues to collaborate and consider the needs of crime victims as well as offenders and the public. An Eastern Shore native, Glen now works for the Talbot County Drug Courts as Coordinator of Juvenile Drug Treatment.
